# LOT 8 CHRISTIAN FURR, 'MINI BATTENBERG' (2019)

Oil on gessoed wooden panel, 20 x 21 cm, framed. Inspired by Leonie Orton's description of her brother's rhapsodic praise of the cake in her memoir, *I Had It In Me*. Donated by the artist.

ESTIMATE: £2,000 - £4,000

Artist Christian Furr (right) pictured with Kenneth Cranham (left). Furr's work was inspired by a passage in Leonie Orton's book, I Had It In Me, where Joe Orton was parading a battenberg around the room.

"Turning the plate around he began to elucidate on its wonderful symmetrical qualities: the pink and yellowness of the sponge and the precision of the marzipan. They both agreed it was as perfect as a cake could be."



Between 1959 and 1962. Orton and his partner Kenneth Halliwell expressed their disdain for mainstream society by playfully redesigning the covers of books stolen from Hampstead and Islington public libraries. After returning the books, the couple would amuse themselves by watching the shocked reaction of unsuspecting readers to the 'absurd or mildly obscene' artwork that they pasted onto dustjackets.

Remastered by Christian Furr, signed by the artist and Leonie Orton, stamped with the seal of the Estate of Joe Orton. Deckled edge prints on Somerset 320gsm paper, 78 × 56 cm (image 65 × 44 cm). Edition of 100. Unframed.


# LOT 10 THE CONNOR BROTHERS 'EVERY SINNER HAS A FUTURE' (2017)

'Up Against It' appeared on the Pet Shop Boys' 1996 album 'Bilingual', with the title borrowed from Joe Orton's never-produced screenplay for The Beatles.
